## DRUMANESS CROSS-COMMUNITY PLAYGROUP, BALLYNAHINCH, CO DOWN, BT24 8NG (4BB-0436)

- 1. The pre-school centre is situated in mobile accommodation in the grounds of Christ the King Primary School, on the Drumsnade Road in Drumaness. Most of the children who attend the centre come from the village of Drumaness and the surrounding rural area. The centre operates morning and afternoon sessions.
- 2. The arrangements for the inspection of pastoral care and child protection included the opportunity for the parents, the management group and the staff to complete a confidential questionnaire prior to the inspection. Eleven parents responded to the questionnaire and seven made additional written comments. The responses from the parents indicate high levels of satisfaction with the quality of the provision and they appreciate:
  - the helpful staff;
  - the happy, friendly atmosphere; and
  - being kept up-to-date on their child's progress.

The responses from the management group and the staff were also positive and supportive of the work of the centre. All of the responses have been taken into account as part of the inspection and were shared with the staff and management group.

- 3. The quality of the arrangements for pastoral care is good. The staff demonstrate a strong commitment to the welfare and development of the children. There is a positive ethos based on the very good working relationships between the staff and children.
- 4. The centre has satisfactory arrangements in place for safeguarding the children. These arrangements broadly reflect the guidance issued by the relevant Department; however, the following minor areas need to be addressed:
  - to update the training in child protection to include all of the staff, and a member of the management committee;
  - review the documentation used for the purposes of risk assessment for trips; and
  - ensure parents are fully aware of, and signed up to, all of the necessary pre-school policies and procedures.
- 5. The centre gives good attention to promoting healthy eating and physical activity which encourage the children to adopt healthy lifestyles.

## 6. The main strengths within the centre's educational and pastoral provision are as follows:

• the learning environment is bright and well-organised, with attractive and colourful displays that celebrate the children's work;

- the daily timetable is well-organised to provide a good balance of free play and adult-led activities. The routines are unobtrusive and used appropriately to provide choice and promote the children's independence;
- during the inspection, there were many good and very good examples of skilful interaction by the staff which extended the children's language and thinking skills;
- there are good opportunities for the children to learn in most areas of the preschool curriculum. Particular strengths of the programme are the promotion of the children's personal, social and emotional development, language, and early mathematical concepts;
- the planning and assessment methods provide helpful guidance for the staff's interaction. The information from the observation of the children's activities and interactions is used well, and increasingly, to plan activities to meet their individual interests and needs; and
- the centre is developing useful links with the local primary school.

# 7. The inspection identified areas for improvement. The following is the most important area that needs attention.

- To develop further the programme for physical play and to improve the associated resources.
- 8. The staff work well as a team and contribute effectively to the good quality of the provision. The leader demonstrates a strong commitment to reviewing and developing the work of the centre; the staff team has identified appropriately the need for further improvement in the outdoor physical play provision.
- 9. The centre has quite recently, and appropriately, re-engaged with support from an early years specialist (EYS). It will be important that staff build upon this and work closely with the EYS in order to address the area for improvement identified during the inspection.
- 10. In the areas inspected, the quality of education provided by the pre-school centre is good. The pre-school centre has important strengths in most of its educational and pastoral provision. The inspection has identified areas for improvement which the centre has demonstrated the capacity to address. The Education and Training Inspectorate will monitor the centre's progress on the areas for improvement.
