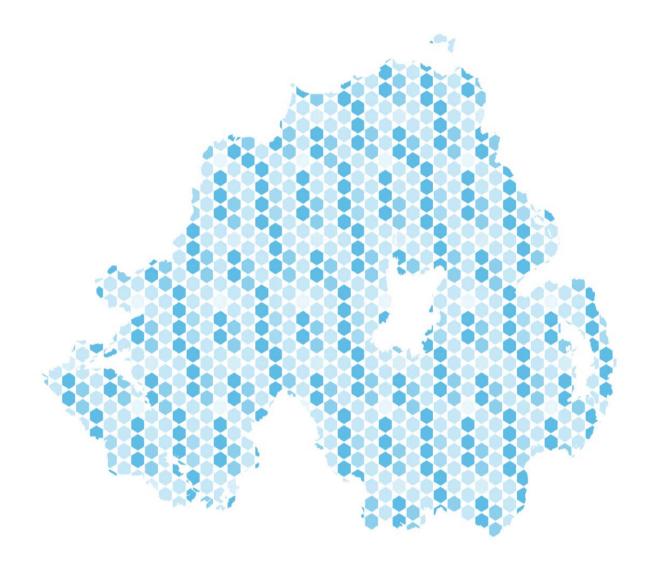

Introduction

The previous inspection in October 2014, evaluated the overall effectiveness of Cairncastle Primary School as good¹. In the interim period, there have been changes to the key roles and responsibilities of co-ordinators, an increase in the number of children presenting with complex additional needs and a decrease in the school enrolment. A sustaining improvement inspection (SII) was conducted on 29 January 2018.

Focus of the inspection

The inspection focused on evaluating the extent to which the school is capable of demonstrating its capacity to effect improvement through self-evaluation and effective school development planning. The school also provided evidence of provision for safeguarding as part of the inspection.

The lines of inquiry during the SII were to:

- improve the processes of monitoring and evaluating to inform the learning and teaching and raise further the children's outcomes; and
- improve the quality of the opportunities for the younger children to develop their selfmanagement skills and make independent choices.

Key findings

- Systematic processes are now in place to monitor and evaluate a broad range of qualitative and quantitative data to inform classroom practice and track the progress of individual children. The children's spelling has improved across the school as a result of using the data to inform new approaches to learning and teaching.
- The younger children collaborate well during their numeracy activities as they apply their mathematical language, skills and knowledge during small group tasks. They make independent choices and decisions to develop their own ideas during their playbased learning.

It will be important that the employing authority, school governors and the staff plan for, and manage, issues related to the sustainability of the school provision and school budget, in order to address the current and future needs of the children and the staff.

Safeguarding

During the inspection, the school provided evidence that the arrangements for safeguarding children reflect the guidance from the Department of Education.

Conclusion

Cairncastle Primary School continues to demonstrate the capacity to identify and bring about improvement in the interest of all the learners. The ETI will continue to monitor how the school sustains improvement. In particular, the ability of the children in key stage 2 to articulate more confidently their mathematical thinking and reasoning and the further development of the action plans to include more measureable targets.
